


Distance Education: Definition and Glossary of Terms, 3rd Ed.

Real-Time Moderated Voice Communication and the Dissertation, Nova Southeastern University, Fischler School of Education and Human Services / Learning Style/Computer Mediated Communication

The purpose of the study was to examine student attitudes toward instructor-moderated, real-time voice communication. Bipolar variables examined were introversion/extroversion. The study was structured to determine whether any one of the moderated voice-communication software. It was also intended that students be grouped by personality type and that additional statistics be run. Gender was also examined in relation to expectations.

A variety of online courses was involved in this study. 30-minute, instructor-moderated, real-time voice-communication sessions were conducted at a distance.

An analysis of the data revealed that regardless of whether students were introverted or extroverted personality types, independent of their attitudes toward instructor-moderated, real-time voice communication, student responses to questions related to communication and learning were similar. Student participants, regardless of their personality type, expressed similar attitudes toward communication and learning.


